Call for Papers

Inequality refers to the phenomenon of unequal and/or unjust distribution of resources and opportunities among members of a given society. The term inequality may mean different things to different people and in different contexts. Moreover, inequality encompasses distinct yet overlapping economic, social and spatial dimensions. Inequality in societies is manifested in caste, class, gender, ethnicity, and power relations. Inequality in a **society** tends to produce social conflict among the social groups such as clash of interest/ violent conflicts between opposing caste groups. Inequalities among **ethnic groups** have led to various ethnic movements demanding separate states or autonomous regions or even secession. **Religious** inequality tends to generate feeling of exclusion among minority groups. **Economic** inequality shows all forms of disparities in the distribution of economic assets and income. How do we measure inequality? What governs variation in levels of inequality? What are the causes and consequences? How is inequality imagined in popular representations? Why does it appear so hard to eliminate it?

Team **Akadem** (ISSN 2231-0584) solicits your contribution towards the next issue of Kamala Nehru College's multidisciplinary peer - reviewed academic journal and this year's theme is: **"Inequality and Society"**. We are interested in receiving both empirical research and theoretical and critical commentaries on the above theme. Submissions may be from any social science or humanities, commerce and science disciplines and we welcome interdisciplinary reflections. Papers will be accepted from scholars, researchers, and faculty members from **all institutions**. The range of enquiry may be economic, social, scientific, philosophical, historical, political, media and cultural studies to understand inequality in all its dimensions, especially in the context of South Asia. The topics for paper submission include, but are not limited to:

- Theorizing inequality
- Inequality and questions around caste, gender and ethnicity
- Economic inequality
- Globalisation and inequality

- Digital divide, technology and inequality
- Inequality in the times of pandemic
- Inequality and political participation
- Educational inequality
- Representing inequality
- Alleviating inequality
- Social mobility and inequality

The last date for submission of all papers is ***20th December 2022, 2359 hours.***

Guidelines for submission:

- Articles must be original and in English. Kindly note that all manuscripts will be checked for plagiarism.
- Only manuscripts of substantial quality will be sent for peer review process.
- There is no fees payable to submit or publish in this journal
- All articles should be typed and composed as a word document (MS Word 2003 and upwards) with the file name aka-xvi (doc and .docx are both acceptable).
- To maintain reasonable uniformity, kindly ensure that the word limit is between 4000-6000.
- Use Times New Roman font; font size for title is 14 points, for main body text, 12 points; and for footnotes 10 points.
- The journal follows the conventions as per the Chicago Manual of Style 17th Edition. For more information on style guidelines: <https://owl.english.purdue.edu/owl/resource/717/01/>
- For citation and referencing, one of the 2 systems specified by the Chicago manual may be followed:

1. Author Date system for in-text citations. (Last name year) or (Last name year, page Number). Example: (Townsend 1993, 12). Corresponding bibliography entry: Author's last name, First name and Initial. Year. Title in italics. Publication location: Publishing company.(See <https://owl.english.purdue.edu/owl/resource/717/10/> for sample paper)

2. Notes-Bibliography system. Include a footnote each time you use a source, whether through a direct quote, paraphrase, or summary. For example, Note: Jack Kerouac, *The Dharma Bums* (New York: Viking Press, 1958), 128. Biblio: Kerouac, Jack. *The Dharma Bums*. New York: Viking Press, 1958. Ethics Policy

- All articles must be unpublished. In case of simultaneous submission, the author is required to inform the journal if the submitted article is accepted for publication elsewhere.
- The journal has a strict policy against plagiarism. Authors may use appropriate software to check for duplication before submission. If plagiarism is detected, either by editorial team or peer reviewers, at any stage during the process of publication, the author will be asked to rewrite and cite resources with due diligence. The editorial team reserves the right to reject articles with extensive plagiarism (25% or more).
- The author should also be cautious regarding duplication of their own material, or self-plagiarism.

Peer-review and publication policy

- Each submission will undergo anonymous peer reviewing from academics from the respective discipline and area of work. In some cases, two or more reviews may be sought if the first review is found to be less acceptable. The comments and suggestions of the reviewer(s) would be made available to the author as soon as they are received. The author will be required to make the necessary changes and resubmit the article. The article may be sent for review again after resubmission, especially in case the changes are found to be unsatisfactory. The entire process follows a double-blind review system, i.e. neither the author nor the reviewer is aware of the others identity.
- All deadlines for revision and submission set by the editors/editorial team must be adhered to. The team may not publish an article not received in time.
- The journal does not levy any submission or publication charges.
- Akademos is published annually and has been published annually since 2006.
